INSTRUCTIONS: First, select a topic for which you have an interest. After researching your topic, you will either write a five paragraph essay about, or create a PowerPoint or Google Slides presentation of your topic.

Basic requirements for Five Paragraph Essay:

<u>Introduction</u> containing significance or importance or relevance of your topic and three aspects of your topic (one paragraph)

<u>Three Body Paragraphs</u>: Each body paragraph details one aspect of your topic (three paragraphs)

<u>Summation or Conclusion</u>: Restate the significance, importance, or relevance of your topic and restate main detail of each aspect of your topic (one paragraph)

<u>Bibliography</u>: minimum 5 Sources. Remember, bibliographies begin with the title of <u>Bibliography</u> and the title is centered. Citations in a bibliography are alphabetized by the author's last name. Therefore each citation begins with the author's last name first. The first line of each citation is flush to the left margin, and succeeding lines are indented three letter spaces. Each citation is single spaced and citations in a bibliography have an empty line between them.

Basic Requirements for Power Point:

<u>Minimum 22 slides</u>. Except for First and Last slide, images are required for each slide. An image may be used in two consecutive slides.

<u>First slide</u> is a Title Page that includes information from the class heading and the topic of the PowerPoint or Google Slides.

<u>Second slide</u> must state significance or importance or relevance of your topic adjacent to a relevant image.

Third slide must state at least three aspects of your topic. Each aspect must be bulleted in some manner adjacent to a relevant image.

<u>Fourth through twenty-first slides</u> explain aspects of your topic using bulleted statements adjacent to a relevant image.

<u>Last slide</u> is a <u>Bibliography</u>: minimum 5 Sources. Remember, bibliographies begin with the title of <u>Bibliography</u> and the title is centered. Citations in a bibliography are alphabetized by the author's last name. Therefore each citation begins with the author's last name first. The first line of each citation is flush to the left margin, and succeeding lines are indented three letter spaces. Each citation is single spaced and citations in a bibliography have an empty line between them.

Student alternatives to an essay or PowerPoint / Google Slides are encouraged, such as a movie with text or dialogue or music or any combination with either moving clips or still pictures. Pairing via any multimedia platform is acceptable. But face to face contact outside of immediate family is prohibited because of our current pandemic restrictions.
