INSTRUCTIONS: Using Google Docs or some other word processing software, create a new file.

Name the file as: p3_lastname_firstname_citation_test (or: p4_lastname_firstname_citation_test).

Set Line spacing to 1 and then write the class heading (see:

http://weisun.org/pid/rubrics/file_namie_pid.pdf) Skip one line and create research citations from the following blurbs of information (remember that a research citation begins with the author's first name and last name). Be certain to use proper indentation, quotation marks, underlining, periods, and skip one line between each citation. After writing the research citations (there are eight), **create a new page (Insert > Page Break), not a new file**, and then use the citations to create a Bibliography or Works Cited page. Be certain to center the title on the page, use proper indentation, and skip one line between each citation. Upon completion of the Bibliography or Works Cited, submit the file via email with following filename: p3_lastname_firstname_citation_test (or: p4_lastname_firstname_citation_test). (And remember: Author. "Article Title." Source. Date.)
