No matter where on the line that the definition ends, go to the next line, without skipping a line, and write a sentence that demonstrates the meaning of the word as used in the article. 
1. On the provided map, identify the Western Hemisphere.

5. On the provided map, locate where the "Fulani people" live and in one or two sentences identify two characteristics of the Fulani as a nomadic people.
6. Write out the religion of one who is "Muslim."
7. Besides Mamout, identify four other historical figures who were painted by Peale.
8. On the provided map, locate Guinea. Why would someone from Guinea speak Fulani?
9. On the provided map, locate Morocco.
10. Make a list of the primary documents within the reading. For example:

1. Charles Willson Peale. (April 15, 1741 – February 22, 1827) was an American painter, soldier, scientist, inventor, politician and naturalist. He is best remembered for his portrait paintings of leading figures of the American Revolution, as well as for establishing one of the first museums. The **Peale Museum**, also known officially as the **Municipal Museum of the City of Baltimore**, was a museum of paintings and natural history, located in the City of Baltimore, Maryland, USA. It occupied the first building in the Western Hemisphere to be designed and built specifically as a museum. The Peale Museum was created by Charles Willson Peale, (1741-1827) and his son Rembrandt Peale, (1778-1860). One of Peale's paintings shows his "1st wife...weeping over their daughter...who died of smallpox."
